### **Course Description**

The goal of the course is to study the Israeli-Palestinian relations from sociological and historical perspectives. The course analyses the Zionist settlement of Palestine and the economic and political relations since then through historical turning points: 1948, 1967, 1987, 1993 and 2000. The relation between political attempts to negotiate and violent attempts to impose unilateral solutions is analysed in this critical points.

### **Requirements:**

Students are expected to attend the classes, read the required readings, and actively participate in class discussions. Student will write four reading reports (two pages) during the quarter and a final integrative memo (5 pages).

#### **Grades:**

40% Reports

60% Final integrative memo.
